VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITIES

How could you make a difference for these organisations and the people they serve?

Children and Youth

- ★ Dee Street Community Centre is looking for volunteers to get involved in their youth programmes. Volunteers help to facilitate the smooth running of their youth schemes on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays by supporting, organising and mentoring the young people. At the moment they are particularly welcoming volunteers who are available on Tuesdays.
- ★ Youth Initiatives has been working hard since 1991 to deliver quality youth programmes to hundreds, that make a life changing difference. Their East Belfast projects are looking for volunteers in the following areas: Streetwork every Friday night. Aimed at reaching out to and building relationship with young people least likely to access youth

provision. **Lifeline** (mixed gender programme, 15-18's) every Tuesday night. A weekly centre based programme aimed at personally, socially and spiritually developing young people within a youth community.

Boys afterschool programme (11-14's) every Tuesday afternoon. An outreach programme that aims to engage young men and provide a safe environment for them to build relationships and design their own programmes.

Girls afterschool programme (11-14's) every Thursday afternoon. An outreach programme that aims to engage young women and provide a safe environment for them to build relationships and design their own programmes.

- ★ Brownie leader with **Willowfield Parish Girl Guides**. The group is for girls from age seven to 10 and meets on Tuesday evenings.
- ★ Afterschools clubs and seasonal schemes with **Avoniel Playcentre**. Volunteers have the opportunity to have an active role in planning, setting up and implementing the sessions.

Conservation

- ★ A Date With Nature assistants based at the Ulster Museum with **RSPB**. This project aims to enthuse people about wildlife and so the volunteers will engage with visitors to talk with them about nature, conservation, the important work that RSPB does and how they can support RSPB with that work.
- ★ Reserve assistant at the RSPB Belfast Harbour Reserve
- ★ Various roles with Lagan Valley Regional Park including; Heritage Guides to help man the Lock Keeper's Cottage and share the history with visitors, Saturday Conservation Volunteers to meet every other Saturday morning and carry out conservation tasks in the park, Volunteer Rangers to support and enhance the Ranger Service and volunteers to record wildlife in the park.

Retail and Catering
