The Dock is a pop-up café in the heart of the Titanic Quarter run completely by volunteers, headed up by Tegan Glover, the Project Manager.

The Dock is a place for building community. That

means Belfast locals meeting students from Belfast Met. chilling out in the middle of exams, local musicians playing an acoustic set, local artists displaying their creativity, knitting groups chatting over the clacking of knitting needles and residents moving into the Titanic Quarter from all across the world.

Of course, community happens best over a cuppa and The Dock has a team of volunteers on hand to make sure the kettle is always on. The volunteers keep the café running Tuesday to Friday 11.00am to 7.00pm and Saturday 11.00am to 5.00pm. Building life in the Titanic Quarter wouldn't happen without them.
